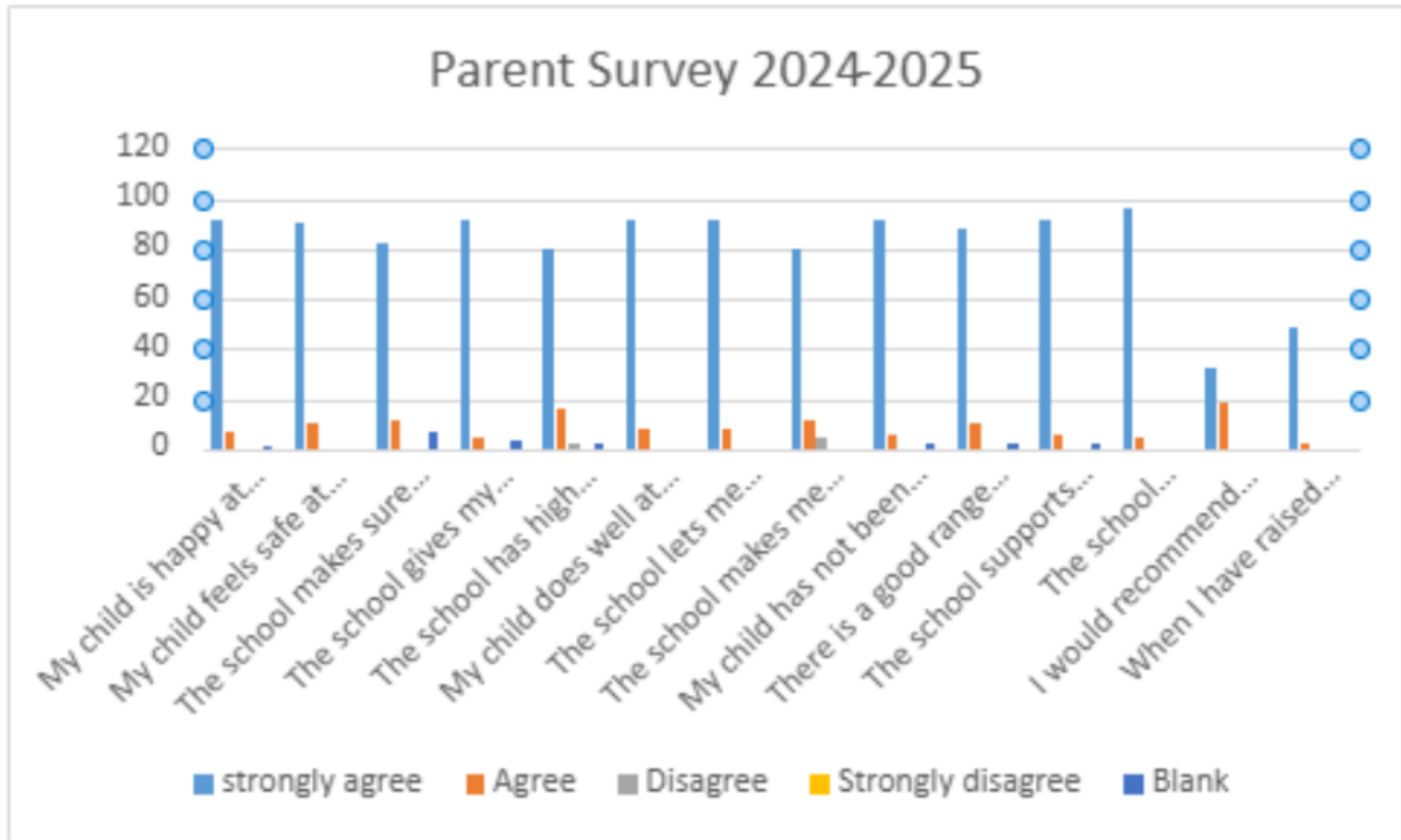


Curnow School Parent Survey 2025



The parent survey was incredibly positive with the vast majority and almost all strongly agreeing with most of the questions asked. We only had 3 responses where parents did not agree and one of these the parents indicated that this was not about us fully understanding their child but more that we couldn't do anymore to support their learning.

We have had some amazing comments with our parent survey and no negative comments at all!

We are also putting in some actions following the survey. These include:

- Working with parents so that we are working towards the same high expectations
- Sharing the curriculum and Pathway offer with parents and linked to this the aspirational aims
- Ensuring parents are informed about what pupils are learning each term so that they can support and reinforce learning at home
- Share with parents the range of activities and 'clubs' through our enrichment offer

A total of 55 parents completed and returned the school questionnaire which is a very good sample size.

The responses are overwhelmingly positive with only 2 parents disagreeing with statements – this related to ‘My child has not been bullied’; we are aware of a very low level of targeted behaviour, which had occurred in the previous year we worked hard to reduce the behaviour and associated risk. It is promising to see that despite this the same parent has again reported that they strongly agree that ‘My child feels safe at this school’, they also agree that ‘The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved’ as well as strongly agreeing that ‘When I have raised concerns they have been dealt with properly’. Another parent disagreed with the statement that ‘the school lets me know how my child is doing’ – we have checked our parent progress meeting records (termly meetings with parents) we always ask if the parent is happy with the communication from school and all have agreed that they are – again no further information has been given/suggestions made for improvements.

It is very pleasing to see that parents agree with all other statements positively.
